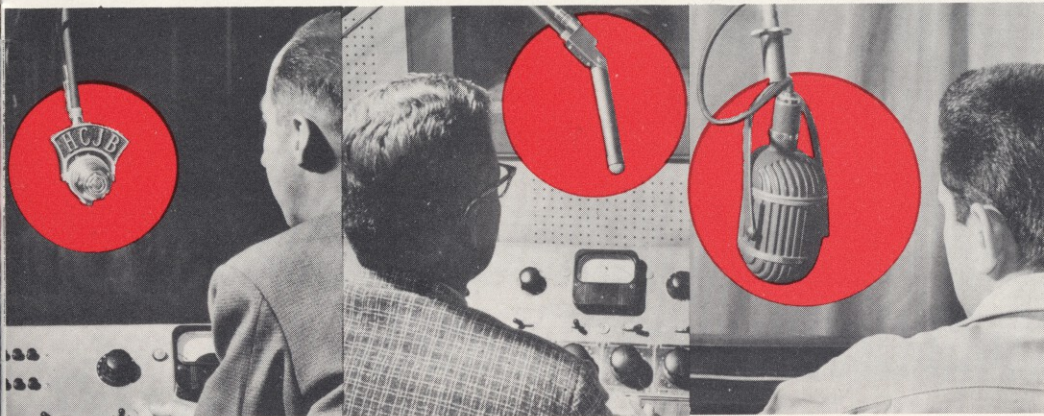
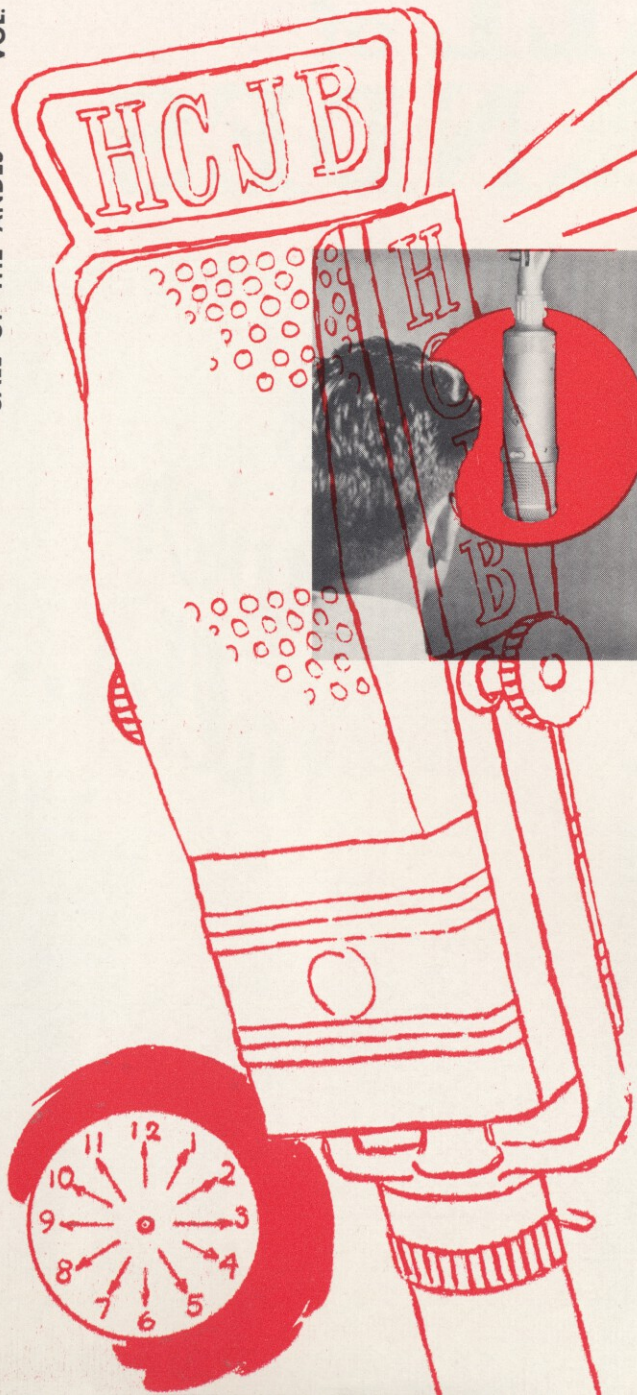

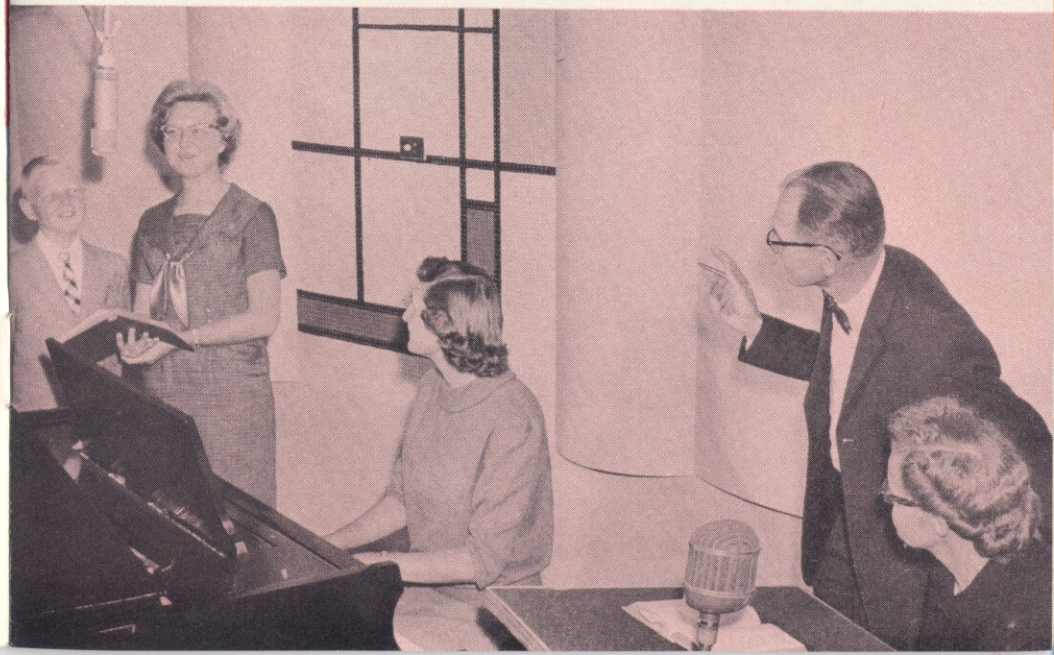

The broadcasts follow in continuous succession in order that the programs may be heard at times convenient for our listeners whatever their latitude and longitude.



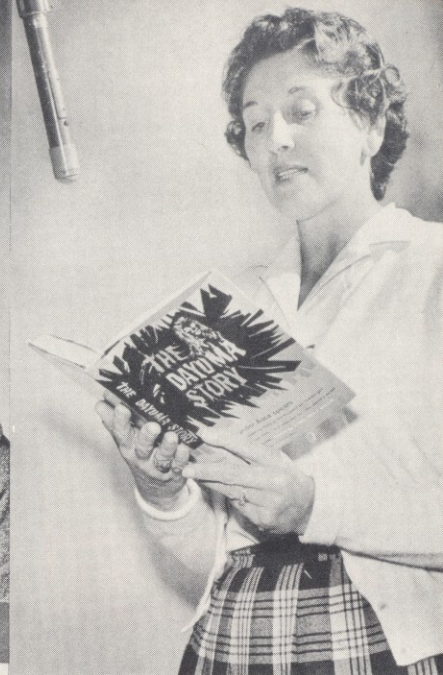

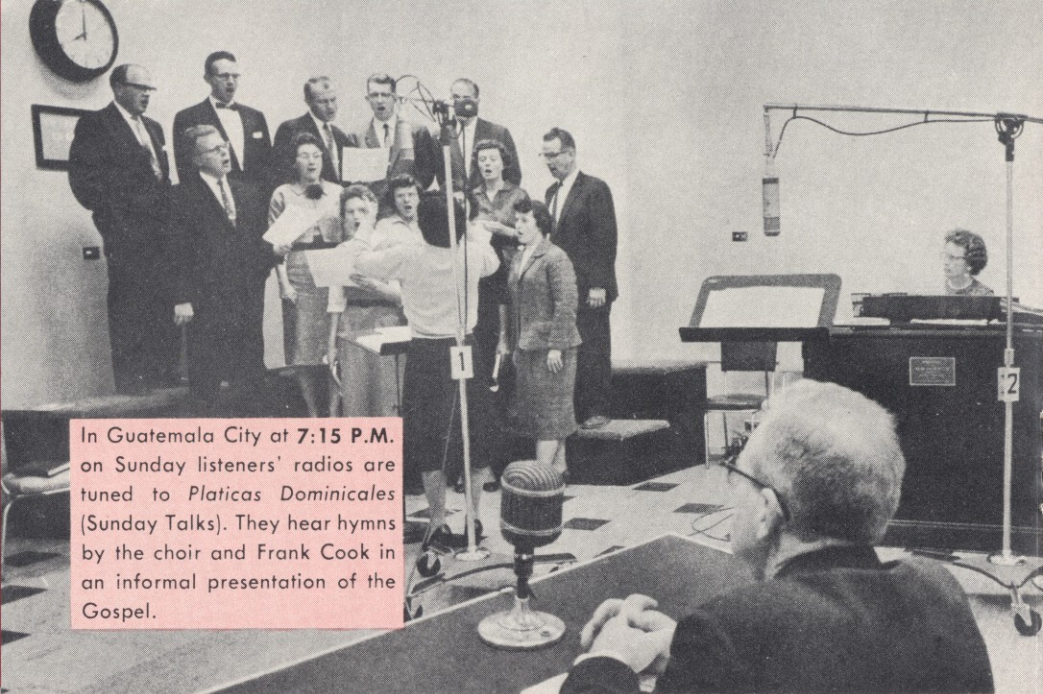
There are listeners in Singapore who enjoy hearing Delores Van Der Puy at 4:20 P.M. as she reviews a new book on her program Book Reviews.

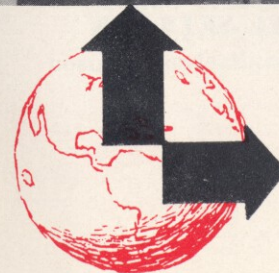

**STATEMENT OF FAITH**

of the World Radio Missionary Fellowship, Inc.

The members represent many denominations and different nationalities, but we are one in our faith.

**I. THE TRINITY . . .** We believe in one God, existing in a Trinity of Persons; Father, Son and Holy Spirit (John 15:26), Who are co-eternal and of equal dignity and power. (Matt. 3:16-17).

**II. THE BIBLE . . .** We believe that the Bible is the Word of God, verbally inspired and without error as originally written, and that it is the only infallible rule of faith and practice for the Christians. (II Tim. 3:16; II Peter 1:21).

**III. THE PLAN OF SALVATION . . .** We believe in Jesus Christ, conceived of the Holy Spirit (Matt. 1:20) born of the Virgin Mary (Luke 1:35), Whose death on the cross for the redemption of sinners provided a sufficient and complete expiation of their guilt (Eph. 1:7), and who rose again for our justification (Rom. 4:25), ascended into heaven, and is now seated at the right hand of the Father, interceding for all those who come unto God by Him (Heb. 7:25). We are "looking for the blessed hope and appearing of the glory of our great God and Saviour Jesus Christ" (Titus 2:13 R. V.), and believe that all things shall finally be subjected unto Him (I Cor. 15:28).

**IV. THE CHURCH . . .** We believe that the true church, which is the body of

Christ (Eph. 1:23), is formed by the work of the Holy Spirit, of all those who trust Christ as their Saviour (Eph. 2:22).

**V. THE CHRISTIAN'S MINISTRY . . .** In view of Christ's last command (Mark 16:15), and recognizing the lost condition of all those who fail to accept the Gospel message (John 3:18-19), we believe in the urgency of every Christian's accepting the Great Commission of Christ, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." (John 3:16).

It is to the work of helping to carry out the plan of God in this age that Radio Station HCJB is dedicated, in conformity with the last command of our Saviour to "go . . . into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature." With the God-given means at our disposal (1 Cor. 9:22), the message of the Gospel, which "is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth" (Rom. 1:16) is being literally carried "unto the uttermost part of the earth" (Acts 1:18). We also seek to carry out the command of our Saviour to "teach all nations" (Matt. 28:19), in addition to evangelizing them.

# WRMF Newscast



## ENGINEERING

Engineering Co-ordinator Herb Jacobson reports from Pifo that the new short wave transmitter for 49 meters has been completed and is now undergoing tests. This addition brings our transmitting units to seven and gives us a total transmitter output of approximately 120,000 watts of power. With this new unit in service our coverage in Ecuador and the neighboring republics beyond the range of our long wave signal is much improved. This transmitter will be used most of the day for this regional service. At night it will also be used to beam programs to the south Pacific area.

According to Phil Turrell's records we bettered our own record in September with only .01% loss of air time per transmitter due to transmitter difficulties.

The new Diesel generator which weighs ten and a half tons and can produce 300,000 watts of power has been installed in Pifo under the direction of Bob Wittig and put to work supplying power to our transmitters.

## BIBLE INSTITUTE OF THE AIR

At a recent Convention of National Churches there were among the delegates four young pastors who testified that they began their preparation for

the Lord's service in a study group in their local church where they studied the Bible Institute of the Air courses under the leadership of their pastor, José Guerrero. These young men later went on to study in a Bible institute, and two of them were ordained to the ministry on October 9th.

## LOCAL EVANGELISM

Missionaries and national workers have witnessed recent blessing of the Lord in the Quito area evidenced by the response to special evangelistic meetings and house to house visitation carried on by the believers in Guangopolo; record attendances in the Tola and the Vicentina groups; conversions in Pintag, Tingo, Vicentina, Pifo and in the church of the Divine Redeemer in Quito; and baptismal services held on the HCJB compound in Quito and in Yaruqui.

## EDUCATION

The evangelical grade school "Escuela Mixta Vozandes", operated on the Pifo Compound for national children, opened on the ninth of October for its fourth year. The teaching staff consists of two qualified national teachers and four missionaries who teach part time. Twenty-seven children are enrolled in the school.
