ON THE FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF THE RUSSIAN PROGRAM
OVER RADIO STATION HCJB.**

We praise God for the past year, during which we have had the privilege of making records in the Russian language and sending them to HCJB, Quito, Ecuador, where they have been broadcast over short wave. In the past 12 months we received wonderfully encouraging letters from many states in the United States; provinces in Canada; Kodiak and Port Graham, Alaska; Iceland; islands in the Atlantic; England; Panamá; Cuba; Argentina, near Mendoza, and Seldovia. Many say they were blessed by these Russian missionary broadcasts from Quito. In some places they listen in regularly every Sunday, gathering together people who understand Russian to listen in. In Cuba they listen regularly. There is no missionary there, and the only way they can get the Gospel is through the radio from this broadcast. The Russians gather together, and they can hardly wait for the broadcast to come on.

The second broadcast added on Saturdays will prove a still greater blessing, and we thank God for this radio station and Clarence Jones and Reuben Larson, Co-directors, and their families, as well as their coworkers on the station. I visited Quito last year, and saw how hard they are laboring, daily. Every hour is occupied, praying, speaking, singing, repairing, visiting Indians in the villages with the loud speaker, correspondence. May the Lord raise up many more prayer warriors and supporters for this wonderful, Pioneer Broadcaster, The Voice of the Andes. God will reward every one who has prayed and helped financially to carry on this most important work, which is carrying the Gospel in many languages to people throughout the world.
