

Many have asked for the following information which we are glad to repeat on behalf of friends who have never yet been able to tune-in on THE PIONEER MISSIONARY BROADCAST ER. There are THREE IMPORTANT FACTS to remember when you attempt to find us on your radio!

- 1) HCJB broadcasts for you on SHORT wave, on 24 meters (or 12½ megacycles). Logically, you cannot hear HCJB on your longwave receiver, as some have tried to do. You must have a shortwave receiver, tuning for HCJB near the 25 meter band, or between numbers 12 and 13 if your dial is marked in megacycles.
- 2) HCJB broadcasts in English THREE TIMES daily Except Monday! Tune for us at the exact time we are "on the air". Here is our schedule of English programs:
  - 8 AM "Morning in the Mountains"
  - 6 PM "Ecuadorean Echoes"
  - 9 PM "The Friendship Hour"
 Also, Sundays only, 10 AM Sunday English Fellowship.
- 3) HCJB broadcasts its programs on Eastern standard time the year around. Though WAR Time has pushed the clocks ahead one hour in every time zone, you can easily figure exactly when HCJB is "on the air" by comparing your standard time to Eastern STANDARD time.

TRY TO TUNE IN HCJB FOR YOURSELF! Many who thought it couldn't be done because Quito is so many thousands of miles away from them, have received the thrill of their lives in actually hearing HCJB for themselves by bearing in mind the three preceding suggestions. We'll appreciate it; You'll enjoy it; Others will be benefited by it.—when you "tune in" on the best things in life on the spiritual oasis on your shortwave dial!

**WILL MISSIONS FAIL, TOO, BECAUSE OF "TOO LITTLE - TOO LATE?"**

**THE GOSPEL HAS FIRST PLACE AT HCJB**

Since Radio Station HCJB, "The Voice of the Andes", was founded some eleven years ago for the express purpose of "Heralding Christ Jesus' Blessings", using radio controlled by missionaries for the first time, it is no wonder that of all the programs broadcast week after week, those of a definitely religious nature should have the preeminence. The choice periods of the day and night reserved by other stations for their best paying commercial programs, are given over to the spreading of the Gospel by Station HCJB.

A total of fifty-eight different Gospel broadcasts are "on the air" each week from The Pioneer Missionary Broadcaster. Considering that most of these go out over two and three of our stations, the wide-spread audience reached and accumulative effect can well be imagined. Dr. Manuel Garrido Aldama directs the Spanish Gospel programs, and from his department go out twenty-eight programs weekly. To our English-speaking listeners go twenty different religious programs each week. There two Swedish Gospel programs; two Russian; two in the Quechua language, and one each in Dutch, and French.

Many other types of programs are broadcast as, in addition to its missionary objective, HCJB has other functions to fulfill as the "Aerial Ambassador of Goodwill to the Americas". Nevertheless, God has signally honored the work of HCJB because, despite the difficulties and failures, weaknesses and flaws inherent in any human organization pioneering a new field of Gospel endeavor, the motivating force and factor has been a sincere desire to win souls to Christ and bless and edify God's children.

In broadcasting these Gospel programs, our confidence is in the inherent power of God's Word to convert the souls of listeners, under the anointing of the Spirit. "Faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God." Please join us in prayer for these seven language groups who are "hearing" the Word of Life, that saving faith may be born in their hearts from above.

**FOREIGN LANGUAGE PROGRAMS AT HCJB**

For some weeks now, Station HCJB has been broadcasting special foreign language programs at 5:30 PM. Eastern Standard Time, Tuesdays through Saturdays. This is a new departure on the part of "The Aerial Ambassador of Good Will to the Americas", and it is directly brought about by the many colonies of refugees from Europe now finding asylum in Ecuador and other South American republics. It has been our purpose and prayer for many months to do something of this kind, and now another dream is being realized by God's grace.

Friends are cordially invited to take note of the following schedule for these Foreign Language programs of HCJB to tune in yourself if you speak or understand the languages indicated, and invite your friends to do so. Above all, please pray for God's blessing upon every part where His Word is proclaimed:

TUESDAYS,	5 : 30 P.M. EST.....	SWEDISH
WEDNESDAYS,	" " "	FRENCH
THURSDAYS,	" " "	CZECHOSLOVAK
FRIDAYS,	" " "	DUTCH
SATURDAYS,	" " "	QUECHUA (the language of the mountain Indians)
		RUSSIAN

These programs are broadcast on two wavelengths simultaneously, - 24 and 73 meters. The programs are composed of educational and cultural features about Ecuador, etc., but at least half the time is given to the Gospel message and music. Response is already coming in showing that these programs are being heard and well received. Our one objective in this, as in all things, is the salvation of souls, and blessing of Christians.

**LOCAL HELPERS FOR FOREIGN LANGUAGE PROGRAMS**

For weeks before the Staff of HCJB decided to begin its Foreign Language programs, we prayed for God's guidance. The first question was whether, in war times with supplies difficult to get, we should use our stations for more programs. The second difficulty was, "Who would talk the various languages for these programs?" God answered both problems gloriously.

As to the further and increasing use of the station, we were met by the challenge of a world "all out" in war, thrusting upon us the opportunity for ministering God's Word to colonies of refugees scattered all over South America and the world. Such a chance to reach people in desperate need would never come to us again! Such a responsibility to proclaim the one message of hope in Christ and reality of His salvation could not be put aside! This is our "day" of opportunity for evangelizing, - we must not let our "visitation" pass unheeded. So, the Staff decided, under God, to push ahead with everything at our command to reach the most possible people for Christ with these extra Foreign language programs, - to "work while it is yet day", trusting Him to prolong the life of the station equipment even as He did the shoes of the Israelites in the wilderness.

But, who would present the programs? Who was there to speak the languages we needed for the new programs? For lack of a Frenchman, we had hesitated for months in putting out the Gospel in that language. God had someone at our very elbows who speaks French perfectly and loves the Lord. How could we reach the Dutch colonies of residents and refugees all over South America? Again, the answer was at our very finger tips! So it has been with each different language, - right here in Quito the major needs have been met, and the rest is handled by records.

Mrs. Campana is a Swede whose home is Chicago; she and Wendell Larson (who spoke little Swedish until he came to Quito) handle the Swedish broadcast on Tuesdays. Mrs. Barnas hails from the low countries of Europe and presents the Gospel in French; Captain Dennis, a veteran of World War I, helps with the cultural part of the French program. The Thursday Czechoslovak program is announced by Prof. Frederick Bloch. This is the only foreign language program which does not yet have someone qualified to present the Gospel. We are trusting God to fill this need since there are thousands who understand the Czech language. Friday's Dutch program is presented by Mrs. Barnas and her daughter, Dora; while Saturday we offer a broadcast in Quechua with Mrs. Ochoa at the microphone, followed by a record in the Russian language prepared by Peter Deyneka of Chicago.

Already letters are coming in telling of listeners to these programs. They encourage us to believe that God will honor this step of faith with the salvation and blessing of many souls. Pray with us to this end, will you?

## HCJB IS STILL "ON THE AIR" THE "CUPBOARD" IS NOT SO BARE!

Last December we told you how bare the «cupboard» of the HCJB supply room was. Many of you responded with your gift to help purchase the tubes, transformers, and thousand-and-one other things essential to operating three radio stations and «Heralding Christ Jesus» Blessings», to keep HCJB «on the air».

The result is that several all-important orders for replacement supplies have been placed in New York where they are awaiting release or delivery from the factory. HCJB must take its place along with thousands of others waiting for its priorities to be realized and materials delivered. We are indeed grateful to Uncle Sam for releasing to us several small shipments already, but the major tube orders, etc., are still waiting.

About half of the funds needed to pay for necessary replacements has come in through the special gifts of friends designated for that purpose. We ask you to praise God with us for what has been given, and pray earnestly with us that remaining funds needed will be forthcoming to purchase these vital supplies, and that priority ratings will be given them so, once bought, they can be shipped to Quito.

The mechanical «life» of HCJB resides in its transmitting tubes and other technical apparatus and equipment. In these dark days, we are claiming Jeremiah 33:3 as our hope and help more than ever before!

### REUBEN AND GRACE LARSON ON FURLOUGH

Travelling by plane and car, the Larsons have reached the U.S. safely after a journey lasting over three months. Since they could not go by steamship due to war conditions, it was necessary for them to go as they could from day to day, making their way from one country to another through Columbia, Central America and Mexico. Thus they begin a year of furlough, but not of rest, in the homeland.

The Larsons have had many precious experiences of God's provision for them enroute and Reuben writes to say that all along the way they have had blessed fellowship with missionaries and Christian workers, and glorious opportunities for witnessing for Christ.

While they will be moving all over the country in meetings, their mail headquarters will be c/o M.M. Lourens, 120 Ocean Parkway, Brooklyn, N.Y., where pastors, missionary leaders and other parties interested in having the Larsons for special services can write to them. As soon as a preliminary schedule of meetings has been arranged by Mr. Larson, we shall be announcing them over HCJB from Quito. Don't miss the chance to hear these dynamic missionaries and see their unusual moving pictures!

### VISIT OF ALDAMAS TO STATES POSTPONED

In our last issue of "NEWSSCRIPT", we mentioned that the Aldama family were to be expected shortly in the U.S. In fact, they left for the coast and made all preliminary arrangements for sailing, even to booking passage. However, last minute refusal of the State Department to vize their passports because of war exigencies and restrictions completely blocked their leaving the country at this time. So, after a time of fruitful service among churches and evangelical groups on the coast, Dr. Aldama and his family, with generous hearts ever obedient to the indications of the Spirit of God, have returned to Quito to take up again his unique ministry at the microphone of HCJB for the Spanish-speaking world.

As soon as the disturbed world conditions permit, the Aldamas will take their furlough, as the Lord leads. In the meantime, we earnestly request our many prayer-warrior friends to hold up this man of God in daily prayer for physical strengthening and spiritual anointing. Without doubt, no man in the world has so large a Spanish-speaking audience as Dr. Aldama, and he needs the sustaining prayer backing of all Christians everywhere who love the work of God around the world.

### ENGLISH-SPEAKING COLONY SPEAKS!

Monday is usually «silent day and night» on the international station of HCJB, but the first Monday of each month at 6 P.M. EST, our friends of the American Colony and others in Quito come to our studio to send their greetings to loved ones and friends in the homelands. In the last broadcast, 32 people used this public service of HCJB and greetings were sent to the U.S., Guatamala, Fiji Islands, Afghanistan, Sweden, Hungary, Hawaii, etc.

Begun for a few friends who wanted to let «ma and pa» at home know that everything was alright with their loved ones in Quito, the program has developed into an essential part of the lives of many at home and Quito. Listeners who have «eavesdropped» on the broadcast say they enjoy it more than a regular radio program.

### PATRIOTIC PROGRAMS

In addition to its Gospel and other type of programs, HCJB is carrying a series of pro-Democracy broadcasts in several different languages, doing our bit toward furthering the cause of the fight for Freedom. In Spanish-America, the "Fifth-Columb" has been carrying on its insidious work for years undermining the strong holds of Democracy.

While we believe that the Gospel is the strongest defense of any nation, yet a clarion call must also be sent out to warn people against rumors, lies, and false propaganda that the Axis powers have spread throughout Central and South America. In cooperation with the Allied legations and refugee colonies, HCJB is carrying a strong schedule of patriotic programs.

## THE "WORLD CLOCK" AT HCJB

When an HCJB announcer comes on the air with a program, he is often heard to say, "Good morning, Good afternoon, and Good evening!" By the many letters received, we are made conscious of the fact that we must live by a "world clock" and not just our time of day in Quito.

For instance, when HCJB presents its "Friendship Hour" at 9 o'clock each night (except Mondays),- we are aware that over in India, friends are tuning us in at their breakfast tables at 7:30 next morning. In hospitals, schools, mission compounds and private homes of Christians and others, HCJB is being regularly heard in India and Africa.

During this same broadcast, our friends in Australia and New Zealand are picking up our signal at 2:30 the afternoon of the next day! In Hawaii it may be only 3 P.M. of today, and in California it is 6 P.M. Over in England, some stay up to hear us at 3 A.M. And so it goes around the world,-as the blessed story of Christ's love is told forth from THE PIONEER MISSIONARY BROADCASTER!

Do you wonder that we rejoice at this far-flung ministry reaching around the world clock? Do you wonder that many times, the responsibility of it humbles us to the dust in prayer for strength and grace not to fail God and those who wait with their fingers on the radio dials? Pray for the Missionary Staff of HCJB that they may ever be Spirit-filled, physically fit and mentally alert to such vast demands and unbelievable possibilities for the Gospel.

God mightily blessed His servant to the Staff of HCJB, and thru the microphone to many thousands around the world. Letters are coming to us telling of the inspiration his series of morning and evening messages were to listeners. Rev. Billheimer, makes use of radio in his work at home, and is thoroughly convinced of the feasibility and effectiveness of this method of radio missionary endeavor.

It was our sad duty to hand our brother Billheimer a cable upon his arrival informing him of the death by drowning of his oldest boy, just nineteen, in Mexico where he was preparing for missionary work among the Indians. God bless our Brother Billheimer as he continues his missionary tour of South America, and his courageous wife and family who "carry on" at home during his absence.

### "SERVICE STRIPES" FOR BOYS IN SERVICE

The Tuesday night Friendship Hour programs are called "Service Stripes" and are dedicated to all men under arms for the United Nations around the world. It is a lively program of military music and bugle calls, but everything centers around a spiritual message for the men who are bravely facing death in the line of duty. It is our conviction that if ever a man needed, Christ it is now, and especially when looking life and death in the face.

"Service Stripes" is listened to by military and navy men in Iceland, Hawaii, Alaska, as well as in the camps around the States and Canada. If you have a man in the armed forces of Uncle Sam or the United Nations, let him know that he can tune to HCJB at 9 P.M. Eastern Standard Time on 24 meters and hear a program especially dedicated to him called "Service Stripes".
