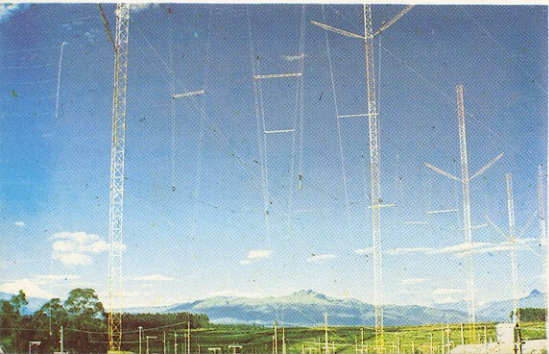

The entrance to Radio HCJB's office and studio complex in Quito, Ecuador. Fifteen miles east at Pifo is the 110-acre antenna site, with 29 tall towers carrying 21 antenna systems, and eight high-powered transmitters. Farther east still, across the 14,000 ft. continental divide, is HCJB's hydroelectric plant at Papallacta, using the headwaters of a tributary of the Amazon. From Quito, around 60 hours of programs go out daily in many languages, reaching effectively to more than 80% of the earth's surface.
